

QUEST FOR PERFORMANCE

Saturday, Feb. 07,2009 – Karl and I headed for the 2009 New Car Show, to see what the auto makers came up with in the line of performance automobiles. We were looking for the sporty types. The James Dean, 1949 Mercury was at the entrance......nice touch!

We checked out the Pontiacs first. Not finding anything sporty....Let's see....Economy, economy, Hummer like truck....truck.....economy....hmmmmm. I guess the economy crisis hit Pontiac the hardest.....or they just didn't bring any to the show. As I looked over the roof of a Pontiac Sedan, I see Galen's smiling face......nice surprise. We chatted a bit and then moved on in our quest. We came across the Ford Mustang Cobra. It meets all the performance standards – 5.4L – 500HP Super Charged. 




