LOWERY'S CUSTON CATALINA



The original owner of our 1953 Pontiac Catalina was a man named Lou Simpkin, who ordered the car with almost every option available that year. These options included, under seat heater and defroster, traffic light viewer, autronic eye, rear fender panel, windshield sun visor, electric radio antenna, illuminated hood ornament, dual back up lamps, under hood lamp and much more. We know nothing about his long ownership of the car. Sometime in the 1970's, my dad, Charles Lowery, traded some mechanic work on Mr. Simpkin's truck for the Pontiac. By this time, the desert sun had bleached the car. It was still in running condition and with all original parts, except the tail lights. Charles moved the car to his ranch where it sat for another several years gathering sand and providing a home for field mice.

Charles had been a mechanic for a Pontiac dealership in Sudan, Texas, in the 1950's and had a "Doctor of Motors" Certificate from Pontiac. He had a real soft spot for Pontiacs. Finally, in the late 1990's dad started working on the '53, with some transmission work and an engine rebuild. Dad passed away in 2002, without finishing the restoration.

My two brothers and I took Dad's Catalina to B & T Restoration in Sparks for rechroming, paint, and interior work, done in original colors. My brother, Jerry and I rewired and did the detail work on the engine and under the hood. We feel the finished product fulfills the vision Dad had for her and I see him smiling every time we get behind the wheel. The car has a Flathead Straight 8, 122 H.P., Dual Range Hydra-matic, Button Tufted Laurel Green upholstery and paint color is Laurel Green.




