

The car was separated from the frame and I had the frame sandblasted. Once it was back in my garage again, I started to disassemble the frame and then rebuild the frame back to stock, even to riveting the ball joints as it was done by the factory; not bolting down as done by after market work. I had the motor done to my specs and I re-assembled the engine. The transmission was rebuilt with a new gear ratio in it. After all this was done, I started with the rear end. I had all the hardware re-plated and slowly started to assemble the frame and power train.

When all this was done, I started to look for a painter who could do the job like the factory did. I first dropped of the body and front end. The car body and parts were chemically stripped and then phosphated to protect the steel. I researched on how the paint was done and how the under carriage was masked before painting. I also found out how the underside and inside of the body was painted at the factory. After the body was painted, we mounted the frame and body together. I loaded the car on a flatbed and took it home to finish the assembly.

In the mean time, we moved from California to Reno and we finished the assembly of the car in time for the 40th Anniversary of the G.T.O.
